## About CAN

CAN is an information & knowledge sharing network for Community Based Rehabilitation (CBR) workers in Africa that was set up to support CBR initiatives through documentation of good practices. Through the efforts of a secretariat team in Uganda, with the support of an executive committee from 8 African countries, CAN facilitates sharing by organising conferences, writer 's workshops, maintaining an up to date website and encouraging the formation of National CBR Associations. CAN information is accessible in most African countries and all over the world.

CAN was formed at a time when existing information about CBR was scarce and when the information that existed was not readily available to those working in the field. Due to the oral tradition that dominates the communication process in Africa, there was very minimal evidence of documentation and sharing of CBR experiences. This undermined the progress of CBR in the rehabilitation of people with disabilities as good practices were not shared and programmes remained unevaluated. This was a threat, especially in African countries which have embraced the CBR approach and yet lack the documented evidence to eloquently defend the strategy.

Through the formation of CAN it is hoped that CBR workers and consumers will have a chance to share their experiences of good and bad practices. Encouraged interaction amongst those involved in CBR and the sharing of experiences and information, will also lead to the development of better CBR practices with the end result of improved quality and human rights of PWDs in Africa.
